HKAC President Dr. Frank Tam's Spring 2024 Message to Alumni & Friends

ong Kong Adventist College ↓ (HKAC) (previously known as China Sanyu Research Institute and South China Union College) has been in existence for over 100 years. The institution is renowned for its commitment to providing quality education with a strong emphasis on values and character development. On October 19, 2023, the Board of Governors of HKAC took an action to start the process of registering the college under Cap. 320 in Hong Kong. The decision that Board took is hugely significant in the history of the college because it will mean that HKAC will become a true postsecondary institution. Besides bearing the status of a postsecondary institution, this registration will bring many potential benefits to the college and its students.

Firstly, registering as a Cap. 320 institution will grant HKAC official recognition from the Hong Kong government. This recognition will enhance the college's credibility and reputation, positioning it as a trusted and reputable educational institution within the local education landscape.

Secondly, as a Cap. 320 institution, HKAC will have the opportunity to offer a wider range of academic programs, including degree programs, satisfying the growing demand for higher education in Hong Kong. This expansion will attract a diverse pool of students and provide them with more options to pursue their academic and career aspirations.

Thirdly, registration as a Cap. 320 institution opens doors to funding opportunities from government grants and subsidies, as well as donations from philanthropists. These financial resources will enable HKAC to invest in infrastructure development, faculty recruitment, research initiatives, and student support services, ultimately enhancing the overall learning experience for students.

Fourthly, registering as a Cap. 320 institution will require HKAC to undergo a rigorous quality assurance process. This process will ensure that the college meets specific educational standards and regulations set by the government. The college's commitment to maintaining and exceeding these standards will further enhance the quality of education provided to its students.

Finally, as a Cap. 320 institution, HKAC's qualifications and credits will be readily recognized by other local educational institutions, facilitating student mobility and transferability. This seamless transition will provide students with greater flexibility in pursuing further education or transferring to other institutions within Hong Kong.

The decision of Hong Kong Adventist College to register as a Cap. 320 institution marks an exciting chapter in its journey towards further growth and excellence.

For this year's mission trip, we worked with Mae Lah Klo Christian School in Thailand. The school is close to the Thai-Burmese border and serves refugee students. We took over teaching their classes, organized afternoon activities, ran a morning and evening gospel week, and week of prayer.

It was beautiful because God was there with us. God is love and we were surrounded by love. The kids were so pure and loving. They found so much joy in simplicity and they were so determined to give the little they had. Receiving their love just made us want to give more. To know that they come from a past of brokenness and yet had so much love to give was amazing. For me, it was evidence that through it all God was with them, reaching out to them with arms of love. God used them to change me.

The kids didn't speak very much English so we shared the gospel in its simplest form. Through smiles, hugs, stickers, sports, body language, laughter, pictures, and songs, we wanted them to know that we love them and more importantly that Jesus loves them even more.

(This school is close to the border of Myanmar in Thailand). The hearts of the missionaries were changed and their lives transformed by the children of Mae Lah Klo Christian School. Who knew the plan that God had for us?

In this mission trip, our main project was the building of five additional lavatories near the classrooms. A portion of the team and some students painted the walls of the lavatories. Also, there were several classes, such as arts & crafts, geography, music, and math that the mission team taught.

There were additional activities such as movement (dancing), sports, choir, and several crafts and artwork in the afternoon. And there were worship meetings in the morning and afternoon. During these meetings, there were singing, Bible skits, and a message for the young students.

A personal experience during the worship meetings: two young boys would always sit beside me during the worship service. They both grew attached to me. Another young boy that I met could dance and beatbox like I could. I declared him my "mini me". It was a wonderful time with these kids.

This mission trip left a lasting impression on the whole team. We never imagined the kind of love that would be shown to us.

Personally, I experienced a kind of innocent love that only children can give to dear family and friends—a kind of love that could never fade from our cherished memories of the trip.



uring the weekly assembly for February 28, 2024, HKAC President Dr. Frank Tam spoke about Hong Kong's National Security Law and the new Article 23 Legislation. At the start of his presentation, Dr. Tam discussed the myriad, major milestones in China's history (including the Hong Kong special administrative region) and in world history to the audience of Hong Kong Adventist College students, faculty, and staff members.

Historic maps of Earth, ranging from the 13th to 20th centuries, were displayed to illustrate colonial empire changes, across major geographic regions. In addition, the past 2000 years' economic growth of eight major countries, including China, expressed in gross domestic product (GDP) output, was highlighted in Dr. Tam's presentation. Attendees learned the highlights about the history of humankind plus leading economies.

Dr. Tam also mentioned **Matthew 22: 17-21** to illustrate that the Holy Bible teaches human beings to not defy their own government and that college community members should comply with local laws, including Hong Kong's National Security Law and the Article 23 Legislation. National Security education presentations occur each semester.





n April 17, 2024, Dr. Arlene Siagian (Div. Chair, Dept. of General Education, Professor of Music, and Choir Director) led the weekly assembly at Bayview Church / King Huy Hall.

Dr. Siagian mentioned that "Music is a gift from God" and that she wished to acknowledge the diligence of all HKAC Choir members. She is very proud of them; choir members paid attention to her critiques of their singing, and they learned how to perform better over time.

Senior college student Evangelina (Lina) Pereverzina (Class of 2024 candidate) discussed what singing meant to her personally. She mentioned a chat that she had with former 2022-2023 student ambassador Mauricio Jaldin Tito Maita (from Southern Adventist University) about the need to use one's entire body as an instrument when singing. Lina also brought up anecdotes about watching alumna Ms. Alison Lau perform the classical Chinese guzheng instrument at the February 1, 2023 assembly and Lina's own father playing instruments; both showed their emotions through their performance body movements and facial expressions. Per Lina, "Most of all, singing to me means to use the body that God has given me. To glorify him in everything that I do." She believes that the HKAC Choir use their God given vocal talent to bless the congregation.

During the assembly, HKAC college students used Angklung Indonesian classical bamboo instruments in a performance to accompany a HKAC Choir member.

Next, the choir sang two "golden oldies" American tunes selected by Dr. Siagian: folk singer Joni Mitchell's 1970's popular hit "Big Yellow Taxi" plus Woody Guthrie and Cisco Houston's 1972 song "900 Miles".

Pounded in 2003, the Harvard University in Asia Program (HUAP) is a nonprofit, student organization that promotes academic, cultural, and social exchange among future, global leaders of the United States and Asia. This year, HUAP hosted an academic and pre-professional conference during January 14-20, 2024, by bringing over 200 delegates from higher education schools all over Asia. HUAP's official partner universities in 2024 included tertiary institutions from Hong Kong, India, Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, Thailand, and Turkey.

I was lucky enough to be invited to attend the 2024 conference. My experience during the conference was frankly one of the most enriching and eye-opening experiences of my life. I was able to socialize, network, and learn from people of all walks of life, including: Harvard College students, Harvard professors, speakers from other top universities (such as M.I.T.), and leaders of various fields. In 2024, the theme of the conference was

"Embracing The Unknown: The Path Less Traveled".

I personally felt particularly connected to this topic, since I have always found myself going the opposite direction from where I am expected to head.

Conformity and I never got along. Hearing success stories from people who had similar attitudes towards life was extremely inspiring!

Amongst all the speakers at the conference was Professor Robert S. Langer Jr., a prominent biotechnologist and chemical engineer, who currently holds the esteemed title of Institute Professor at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, which is the highest honor for M.I.T. faculty members. Professor Langer's impact most notably addresses drug delivery systems and tissue engineering with an impressive portfolio of 1,400 patents and holds the record as the most cited engineer in history. He is the co-founder of Moderna, which is a biotechnology firm that is focused on MRNA therapeutics, such as one of the main Covid-19 vaccines rapidly developed and globally deployed, during the most recent years' global pandemic.

Currently, Professor Langer heads MIT's largest biomedical engineering lab that has won over 200 major awards. Forbes consistently acknowledges Professor Langer among the most influential figures in biotechnology. He is a pioneer in his field and has inspired thousands of

STEM students who have all most likely quoted him in their works. In his talk, Professor Langer spoke of the origin story of his success. He is a brilliant man who persevered through so many turning points in his career. Having the opportunity to learn from one of the most influential scientists of our time was an invaluable honor, despite being in a different field from my own. The knowledge and insights passed down during this experience were priceless, and I greatly appreciated the chance to gain wisdom from such a brilliant person.

nother very notable speaker from whom I learned tons was Dr. Alen Juginovic who is a medical doctor and postdoctoral fellow at Harvard Medical School's Department of Neurobiology. Dr. Juginovic works in the field of sleep medicine — more specifically the effects of sleep deprivation on health. Currently, he teaches as a head tutor an advanced tutorial titled "Neurobiology of emotions and mood disorders" at Harvard College. As a Psychology major, I had many questions and was very eager to learn from him. However, I was pleasantly surprised by the content of his lecture. I was expecting to feel somewhat like a spectator to his presentation. I could not imagine that I would relate so much to his story. The lecture was not science-based at all; instead, it was the story of an ambitious and opportunistic young student from a small town in Croatia who saw an opportunity and took a plunge headfirst into uncertainty and came out the other end with a success

Dr. Juginovic came to America with a wish to see the best laboratories of the country, and he left with a job offer at Harvard Medical School! My biggest takeaway from his lecture was a reinforcement of a motto I was taught at a young age and carried with me all my life and through all my decisions: "Never tell yourself no, let other people tell you no. And even when they do, don't accept no for an answer." At times being so persistent can be exhausting, but seeing someone who holds similar values to mine, and with such a phenomenal success story was reassuring to say the least.

During my time at Harvard University Asia Pacific's 2024 conference, I learned that choosing the path of *most* resistance may seem counterintuitive, difficult and uncertain and that can be really scary. However, looking at challenges as opportunities can







KAC Associate Professor Dr. Hoi Ling Calvin Luk, who teaches full-time courses in chemistry and mathematics in HKAC's Department of General Education, co-published a research paper on March 8th 2024, in a leading academic chemistry journal "Chemistry Europe" via European Chemical Societies Publishing online.


Below is the Full Abstract Summary:

This research article uses density functional theory (DFT) to study photoinduced borylation. This work examined the electron donor-acceptor complex (EDA) of bis(catecholato) diboron with different redox-active leaving groups and bis(pinacol)diboron with aryl N-hydroxyphthalimide. The results of these DFT studies show the complex ratio of B₂cat₂ and N, Ndimethylacetamide (DMA) should be 1:2 which is consistent with the experimental results in the literature. We further proposed a reaction mechanism and calculated the energies associated with each step.




Conclusions Quoted from the Paper:


In this journal, we have reviewed the photoinduced borylation reaction form Aggarwal and Glorius work. We determine the ratio of the bis (catecholato)diboron with DMA complex should be a 1:2 complex, instead of 1:1 ratio. After know the 1:2 complex is involved in the reactions of interest, we propose reaction mechanisms based on charge transfer from the B₂cat₂ complex to different acceptor groups. The acceptor would then undergo fragmentation to form a radical species that then undergoes radical coupling.




We also worked out the overall reaction mechanism for the photoinduced borylation via a source of B₂pin₂ for the reactions of interest in this study. We also compare the energy of different boron source, B2cat2 and B₂pin₂. The main difference of B₂cat₂ can form adduct with neutral Lewis base, while B2pin2 can only form adduct with anionic ligand. Such variation affect the reaction mechanism and energy of each steps. In our calculation, the NHPI ester is the best among three leaving group.

Edvan Jazziel Benitez Mendez was seconded from Southern Adventist University (SAU), during Fall 2022 to Spring 2023, to serve as a Student Ambassador to Hong Kong Adventist College. Community Emphasis

During election speeches, given during convocation on Thursday, Feb. 15, Benitez said, "I want to emphasize that I want to serve you because this campaign is not about me. It's about us. It's about our community."

In a recent interview with the *Accent*, Benitez once again highlighted his focus on community by pointing out that each of the winning candidates' campaign platforms focused on connection and friendship.

"We want to build community here on campus," he said. "Especially for me, I have a heart for those who feel lonely."

According to Benitez, loneliness is a prominent issue on campus. He has spoken to several students about their Southern experience, he said, and while many have given him positive feedback, they also mention a deficient social aspect.

Fulfilling Promises

Benitez listed several plans for student life improvement in his campaign platform, including the addition of electric scooters and a food delivery service to campus, among other things.

When asked about the feasibility of fulfilling his campaign promises next year, Benitez said the ideas included in his platform were pre-approved by Student Development, a signal that both Dennis Negron, vice president for the department, and Alexis Grentz, director of student life and activities, believe they can be accomplished.

Association (SA) president last Thursday (February 22, 2024) in the closest presidential election since 2013, when Southern Adventist University began using Survey-Monkey to conduct voting.

Benitez, senior theology major, beat his opponent, Bryson Baird, sophomore engineering major, by 40 votes.

One thousand and eighty-six students voted in this year's general election for the 2024-2025 SA officers. Benitez received 563 votes (51.84%),
